Year 7 Catch Up Funding 2018-2019

Year 7 Catch up funding is allocated to schools for each Year 7 student who did not achieve a national benchmark scaled score of 100 in reading and/or mathematics. In 2018/19 St Wilfrid's received £19,929. The rationale for it is to enable this cohort of students to catch up quickly so avoiding falling further behind.

In 2018-2019, 91 students joined year 7 with Key Stage 2 scaled scores below 100 (69 for reading and 60 for maths). The Year 7 Catch up funding was used to support the following intervention strategies:

Further support through additional home learning, form time revision and Hegarty Maths has been provided as students move into Y8.

There are 82 students in Year 7 that achieved scaled scores below 100 in reading and/or maths on entry, with 67 below for reading and 42 below for maths.
